
TERMS OF SALE



Very Good or better with a small name on the free front endpaper, light foxing to the pastedowns, top textblock and to the jacket's reverse. Jacket's spine panel and folds toned. A cultural and philosophical history of Zen Buddhism. Alan Watts Organization, "Alan Watts". Alan Watts wrote prolifically about eastern philosophy and the concept of Zen, and helped to popularize several concepts of Eastern philosophy to a western readership. His work was intended to be accessible to those with a scholarly bent and to those without one. Watts also wrote several texts on comparative religion, and had a keen insight into human culture and thought across the globe. \$1,250









Extraordinarily difficult to find in the first edition and in collectible condition. Superstring theory and string theory has evolved over the years from a theory that may explain and

unify the fundamental forces of the universe to an area of research which has yielded enormous productivity in the fields of mathematics and quantum computing. While it is uncertain what the theory's final legacy will be, it nevertheless remains an active field of research and it was a highly influential field of study at the end of the twentieth century and into the twenty-first century. This set was written by one of the founders of superstring theory (John H. Schwarz), and the founder of M theory (Edward Witten). Witten and Schwarz are legendary physicists, and both won numerous awards over their lifetimes for their work in science and mathematics. This set provides a window into the transition theoretical physics made from the Cold War era into its present day state. \$750





Stanford Encyclopedia of Philosophy, "Frantz Fanon". Fanon's first major work, first published in France in 1952. Fanon's writing is foundational to the philosophy of race: here he synthesizes existentialism and the dialectic to explore the origins of anti-Blackness and how colonialism perpetuates these attitudes, how it oppresses those it subjugates. Fanon's time in the Carribbean and on Martinique provided a critical perspective for his analysis of the experiences of those in the African diaspora. A masterpiece of sociology and post-modern philosophy, Fanon's work is crucial to understanding the twentieth-century uprisings against colonial rule, and for understanding modern race relations. \$650





Bell was a physicist best-known for his work in particle physics and on the foundations of quantum mechanics. This books collects his papers on the latter topic including his well-known paper "On the Einstein-Podolsky-Rosen Paradox" in which he published the results that are now known as Bell's Theorem. A handsome copy of this important collection, of great significance to both physics and to philosophy of science. \$250



His thesis has implications for personal identity, existence over time, vagueness, and the language we use to describe physical objects. An important and frequently cited work in contemporary metaphysics. A beautiful copy of a book that is difficult to find in the first edition. **\$250**

Austin is one of the principal figures in the development of ordinary language philosophy which became extraordinarily influential in analytic philosophy during the twentieth century. How to Do Things with Words is Austin's best-known work, and is largely concerned with speech acts (when a speaker uses language to do something over and above or instead of expressing a proposition). The study of speech acts has since become a significant area of research in linguistics and philosophy of language. A very attractive copy of this important and influential work, uncommon in such fine condition. \$750



When three or more notes are played together as one, they form a chord. A chord is of the same value in duration of time as a single note of the same denomination,

The Barre.

The barré is made by pressing the first finger of the left hand squarely across the finger-board.

Positions.

Positions are taken at each fret on the finger-board, either with the ordinary fingering or by the barré. When required to be taken they will be denoted by a letter P, placed over the note or chord.


The Pause.

The pause () is a sign placed over a note or chord to denote that its duration of time may be increased according to the judgment of the performer.

The Tie and Slur.

The Tie is a curved line placed over or under two or more notes occupying the same position upon the staff, and signifies that the first only is to be sounded, and the time of the others counted.


The SLUR is also a curved line, similar to the *tie*, placed over two or more notes, and denotes that the first note only is to be played by the *right hand*; the following notes being produced by quickly and forcibly stopping the strings with the fingers of the left hand.



Elmira Star-Gazette, Diane Janowski, "Elmira History: Remembering banjo pioneer Frank Buchanan Converse". Converse toured as a musician throughout the nineteenth century in a minstrel company, playing in locations around the United States and in London. Some historians gave him the nickname, "The Father of the Banjo", as he greatly popularized the instrument in the United States by touring and writing about its musicianship. According to the *Star Gazette*, Converse wrote at least nine books on playing the banjo, and many musicologists agree today that his method of playing has yet to be improved upon. 
foreign correspondent for a few different news wires until CBS hired him in the 1930's. He became one of "Murrow's boys" (helping Edward R. Murrow coordinate and deliver world-wide news round-ups). Shirer also intently covered the first year of the Second World War until he was alerted that the Gestapo was building an espionage case against him. Fleeing death at the hands of the Nazis, Shirer left Berlin and smuggled his diaries out of Germany. Shortly after he fled Germany, he published his personal diaries. A beautiful copy of Shirer's contemporary record of the Nazi party and the beginning of the Second World War. \$500



The autobiography captures moments from Adams' long life: beginning with his youth and early career spanning to moments from the debates of the first Continental Congress. Within the diary Adams also reveals historic details about the diplomacy surrounding the American revolution. A sharp set of the second President of the United States' memoirs and recollections of his political role during the Revolutionary War and of his lived experience during the end of the American Colonial era. These diaries were the beginning of Harvard's goal of publishing John Adams' primary source materials: the university press would go on to release several more volumes later in the 1960's. \$500





The main image is a gelatin silver print of Charles Chaplin taken in 1925, the print done by Edward Steichen. The poster is printed in black, white, and grey. The exhibition was featured at the National Gallery of Art in Washington, D.C. from May 7 1989 - July 30 1989, then at The Art Institute of Chicago from September 16 1989 to November 26 1989, and finally in the Los Angeles County Museum of Art from December 21 1989 to February 25 1990. The exhibition was made possible by a grant from Eastman Kodak Company. Very near Fine. National Gallery of Art, "On the Art of Fixing a Shadow: 150 Years of Photography". Over 400 photographs were chosen from private collections and museums around the world for this exhibition. The earliest image dated to 1839, the latest to 1989. The work of over 200 photographers was featured. The exhibition showcased innovations in photography over the course of its history. The exhibition also commemmorated the 150th anniversary of William Henry Fox Talbot's invention of "the negative-positive process of photography" in 1839. This invention gave the exhibition its name. Curators from The Art Institute of Chicago and from the National Gallery of Art collaborated to put on the exhibition. \$200
