Difficult to find signed, this is a pleasing copy of George's classic tale of survival. The story juxtaposes the frenetic qualities of civilization to the peace of nature. \$300






The first American edition of Du Maurier's semi-autobiographical novel, in which a Martian spirit helps the main character navigate life's trials and tribulations. The Martian being is incarnated in the form of the character's daughter, and then returns to Mars once the daughter passes away in the story. The front board's design done by the beloved graphic designer and book designer Margaret Armstrong. A fascinating literary work with elements of science fiction. \$250



A Fine book in a Near Fine dust jacket with a touch of rubbing to its spine panel. Dirac was one of the twentieth century's most important theoretical physicists and was the winner (along with Erwin Schrodinger) of the 1933 Nobel Prize in physics. A sharp copy of this wonderfully concise (as one would expect from Dirac) overview of Einstein's general theory of relativity. \$250

Both the book and the jacket are found in multiple states, but priority has not been convincingly established. The present copy has the jacket that lacks the advertising blurb on the rear flap. Near Fine. One leaf with a small smudge; jacket with a crease that runs the length of its front panel. A very attractive copy of this book which Gleick (in his well-known biography of Feynman) refers to as "a model of science writing". \$250










Williams 44. The first American edition of The Hunting of the Snark was done in 1876 by James Osgood. This is the first edition with Newell's illustrations, perfectly representative of the "very good nonsense" that is The Hunting of the Snark. \$250

The front joint heavily rubbed. Evans 24252. Oxford DNB, Leslie Stephen; K.D. Reynolds, "Dymond, Jonathan (1796–1828)". The Oxford DNB characterizes this book as his "chief publication", published posthumously in 1829. Robert Southey, the famous Quaker activist, wrote a positive review of Dymond's book. Dymond's treatise here explores different ethical theories and criticizes utilitarianism. In the Quaker tradition, Dymond's book is vehemently anti-war. Dymond's work is difficult to find in any edition. \$200











From the Oxford DNB: "In 1879 Arnold published The Light of Asia, a versified account of the life and teachings of Siddhartha Gautama, the founder of Buddhism. It proved to be tremendously popular; there were sixty editions in England and eighty in America, and translations were numerous. Its apparent promotion of Buddhist values and beliefs aroused the hostility of some Christian commentators, but it was warmly received in the Buddhist world; the king of Siam conferred the order of the White Elephant on Arnold for services to Buddhism in 1879. In an attempt to placate his critics, Arnold published a sequel in 1891 on the life of Christ called The Light of the World, but it proved a signal failure." \$100
